Papers must be submitted electronically in PDF format before Monday, March 10, 2009. **Papers must not exceed 10 MByte in file size.** Papers should follow the paper format provided at www.cssci.org. The papers will be distributed at the conference. Submission instructions will be provided in the acceptance notification. Early submission of papers is strongly encouraged to ensure timely preparation and distribution of the manuscripts.

Student presenters attending from a distance greater than 50 miles from Ann Arbor, Michigan are eligible for a stipend (one per person). Submit requests for student stipend within two weeks after the meeting to Dr. Tom Briggs at briggste@ornl.gov.
